What is EKNPLC's **Home Visiting Program?**

EKNPLC's team of health professionals coordinates and delivers primary care to you directly in your home.

The team working together to assist in your care includes:

- Nurse Practitioners
- Dietitian
- Social Worker

Who is eligible?

This program is available to individuals 19+ living in our catchment area.



You must be willing to transfer care to our clinic if you already have a primary health care provider. We accept individuals who are homebound due to: mental health. dementia, bedbound, impaired mobility, and/or terminal illness.

Please check our full list of eligibility criteria!

What services do we provide?

- Routine health exams
- Immunizations
- Laboratory tests (bloodwork)
- Manage prescription medications
- Completing forms
- Post-hospitalization check-ups
- Manage acute/episodic concerns
- Manage chronic conditions

We help our patients manage conditions such as diabetes, high blood pressure, heart failure, kidney failure, chest infections, urine infections, etc.

Caregiver Support

Our social worker may be accessed for one-on-one counselling and other resources for caregivers.

How often are the home visits?

You will be seen every three months by a Nurse Practitioner. Additional visits may be arranged as necessary. Your needs will be assessed and a care plan will be developed to match those needs.

What information will we need from you?

- Power of Attorney and/or next of kin documents
- Public guardian/trustee information
- Medical records, including a list of medications and allergies
- Pharmacy contact information

What documents will you receive from us?

- A primary care provider card which can be presented to your specialists or the emergency department so that your medical and/or discharge information will be sent to us
- Our contact information
- Agreement
